เพิ่มประมาณการกำไรจากการบริหารต้นทุนที่ดีเยี่ยม

จากอัตรากำไรขั้นตันที่สูงกว่าคาดของ AH ใน 3Q20 ที่ 10% (ซึ่งสูงเป็นอันดับสองในช่วง ทศวรรษที่ผ่านมาแม้ว่ารายได้จะอ่อนแอเมื่อเทียบกับในอดีต) รวมถึงกำไรปกติที่สูงเกินคาด โดยอยู่ที่ 250 ลบ. ทำให้เราปรับเพิ่มประมาณการกำไรของเราโดยเพิ่มสมมติฐานอัตรากำไร ขั้นต้นของเราเป็น 7.5% จาก 5.5% สำหรับปี 2020 และทำให้เราคาดว่ากำไรปกติในปี 2020 จะอยู่ที่ 213 ลบ. เทียบกับประมาณการก่อนหน้าที่คาดว่าบริษัทฯ จะขาดทุน 116 ลบ. นอกจากนี้ เรายังปรับเพิ่มประมาณการกำไรของเราในปี 2021 จากอัตรากำไรขั้นตันที่สูงขึ้นอีก ด้วย

ผลประกอบการ 3Q20 สูงเกินคาด

AH รายงานกำไรปกติใน 3Q20 ที่ 250 ลบ. (+234% y-y) พื้นตัวดีจากที่เคยขาดทุน 493 ลบ. ในไตรมาสก่อนหน้า รวมถึงสูงกว่าประมาณการทั้งของตลาดและของเรา บริษัทฯ รายงาน รายได้ตามคาด โดยอยู่ที่ 4.7พัน ลบ. (+8% y-y, +136% q-q) จากรายได้ธุรกิจชิ้นส่วนยาน ยนต์และตัวแทนจำหน่ายรถยนต์ที่เพิ่มขึ้น 7% และ 13% y-y ตามลำดับ หลังควบรวมธุรกิจ ชิ้นส่วนยานยนต์ในโปรตุเกส พร้อมไปกับยอดขายรถยนต์ในประเทศที่อยู่ในระดับสูง นอกจากนี้อัตรากำไรขั้นต้นยังปรับตัวดีขึ้นเป็น 10% เทียบกับ 8.9% ใน 3Q19 บริษัทฯ สามารถจัดการต้นทุนได้มีประสิทธิภาพมากยิ่งขึ้นผ่านแผนการลดต้นทุน การเร่งปรับปรุง ความสามารถในการผลิต และจากปริมาณขายที่สูงขึ้นจากรถยนต์รุ่นใหม่

แนวโน้มดีในปีหน้า

เมื่อไม่นานมานี้ AH พึ่งจะควบรวมผลประกอบการของกิจการในโปรตุเกส (คิดเป็นประมาณ 20% ของรายได้รวมใน 3Q20) ไว้ในงบการเงินของบริษัทฯ หากบริษัทฯ สามารถรักษาอัตรา กำไรขั้นต้นไว้ได้สูงกว่า 10% ในเวลาที่เราคาดว่าอุตสาหกรรมจะเริ่มฟื้นตัวอย่างช้า ๆ นับตั้งแต่ปีหน้าเป็นต้นไป เราเชื่อว่าอัตรากำไรดังกล่าวจะกลายเป็นมาตรฐานใหม่ของบริษัทฯ เนื่องจากAH ไม่เคยรายงานอัตรากำไรถึง 10% ในปีใด ๆ ในช่วง 10 ปีที่ผ่านมา

คงคำแนะนำซื้อโดยมีราคาเป้าหมายใหม่ที่ 17.6 บาท


เราเห็นว่าการเติบโตของกำไรที่คาดว่าจะอยู่ในระดับสูงในปีหน้าถึง 520% y-y เป็นปัจจัยสำคัญ ของบริษัทฯ เราปรับเพิ่มประมาณการกำไรของเราในปี 2020-2021 และราคาเป้าหมายของเรา เป็น 17.6 บาทจาก 14.4 บาทโดยมีสมมติฐานจากค่า 2021E P/E ที่ 9.1x (+0.5SD ของ ค่าเฉลี่ย PE 5 ปีย้อนหลัง) ปัจจุบัน AH มีการซื้อขายในราคาที่ต่ำกว่าที่ควรจะเป็น โดยคิดเป็น ค่า 2021E P/E ที่เพียง 7.8x และค่า 2021E P/BV ที่ 0.6x

Investment thesis

Aapico Hitech (AH TB) is Thailand's biggest automotive company in terms of revenue. It has various investments overseas, mainly in China, Portugal, and Malaysia.

Thailand's automobile manufacturing industry is one of the largest drivers of the country's economy. The demand for new cars in Thailand has consistently remained at 0.8-1m units per year, according to historical data. Therefore, when the economy returns to normal, we expect Thailand's automobile production volume to also return to its normal level – compared to the 2020E production level of 1.3m units – which could directly benefit AH because 65% of its operational revenue comes from Thailand.

Company profile

The company's main businesses are the manufacture of OEM automotive parts, designing, producing, and installing assembly jigs and stamping dies. The company has invested in other businesses associated with the automotive industry, including car dealerships and IoT connectivity and mobility businesses.

Manufacture of auto parts - 70.2 %




