# ผลประกอบการ 2Q22 อยู่ในเกณฑ์ดีจากค่าการกลั่น (GRM) ที่ สูงขึ้น

- กำไรสุทธิ์ 2Q22 อยู่ที่ 5.3พัน ลบ. (+21% q-q, +199% y-y) ส่วนมากจากผลขาดทุน พิเศษหลังหักภาษี
- ทำไรปกติอยู่ที่ 7.4พัน ลบ. เพิ่มขึ้น 213% q-q จาก GRM ที่สูงขึ้นและอัตราการใช้ กำลังการผลิตที่สูงถึง 102%
- คงแนะนำซื้อที่ราคาเป้าหมาย 41 บาท

# ธุรกิจโรงกลั่นที่ดีดกลับช่วยกระตุ้นผลประกอบการ 2Q22

กำไรสุทธิ 2Q22 อยู่ที่ 5.3พัน ลบ. (+21% q-q, +199% y-y) กำไรดังกล่าวต่ำกว่าที่ตลาดคาด 15% และที่เราคาด 1% ส่วนมากจากผลขาดทุนพิเศษหลังหักภาษี กำไรปกติอยู่ที่ 7.4พัน ลบ. เพิ่มขึ้น 213% q-q จาก GRM ที่สูงขึ้นและอัตราการใช้กำลังการผลิตที่สูงถึง 102% (หรือ 122.5kbpd) ใน 2Q22 บริษัทฯ รายงานรายการพิเศษก่อนภาษีหลายรายการประกอบด้วย: 1) กำไรสินค้าน้ำมันคงคลัง 4.3พัน ลบ.; 2) ผลขาดทุนสัญญาป้องกันความเสี่ยง (Hedging loss) 6.4พัน ลบ.; 3) ผลขาดทุนอัตราแลกเปลี่ยน 516 ลบ.; และ 4) ผลขาดทุนจากการต้อยค่า 20 ลง

# GRM ที่สูงขึ้นชดเชยกับ Hedging loss ที่เพิ่มขึ้น

ใน 2Q22 EBITDA รวมอยู่ที่ 12.6พัน ลบ. ลดลง 8% q-q จาก Hedging loss ที่สูงขึ้นแม้ว่า GRM จะปรับขึ้นสูง GRM ทางบัญชีอยู่ที่ USD17.6/bbl เพิ่มขึ้น 33% q-q จากกำไรสินค้าคง คลังที่สูงขึ้น GRM อยู่ที่ USD24.4/bbl เพิ่มขึ้น 257% q-q จาก Product margin ที่สูงขึ้น q-q และยอดขาย Unconverted oil ที่สูงขึ้น EBITDA ในธุรกิจโรงไฟฟ้าอยู่ที่ 1.1พัน ลบ. (+11.5% y-y, -64% q-q) จากกำไรการขายเงินลงทุน 2พัน ลบ. ใน 1Q22 ที่หายไป

## EBITDA ในธุรกิจการตลาดเพิ่มในขณะที่ตัวเลขในธุรกิจ Biodiesel และสำรวจ และผลิต (E&P) ลดลง

ใน 2Q22 EBITDA ในธุรกิจการตลาดอยู่ที่ 1.5พัน ลบ. (+78% y-y, +31% q-q) จากค่า การตลาดที่ปรับขึ้นเป็น 0.94 บาท/ลิตร (+59% q-q) และสถานีบริการน้ำมันใหม่ 9 แห่งซึ่งทำ ให้ตัวเลขสถานีบริการฯ รวมอยู่ที่ 1,301 แห่ง ปริมาณขายในธุรกิจการตลาดกระโดดเพิ่มจาก ปริมาณขายในธุรกิจอุตสาหกรรมที่สูงขึ้นเป็น 300ล้านลิตร (+60% y-y, +5% q-q) และปริมาณ ขายในธุรกิจสถานีบริการน้ำมันปลีกที่สูงขึ้นเป็น 1,170ล้านลิตร (+18% y-y, +4% q-q) EBITDA ในธุรกิจ Biodiesel ลดลงเหลือ 93 ลบ. (-69% y-y, -73% q-q) จากความต้องการที่ ลดลงและต้นทุนวัตถุดิบน้ำมันปาล์มดิบที่สูงขึ้น ธุรกิจ E&P รายงาน EBITDA ลดลง 17% q-q มาอยู่ที่ 3.5พัน ลบ. จากราคาก๊าซที่ลดลง 54% q-q มาอยู่ที่ USD14.7/mmbtu แม้ว่าปริมาณ ขายจะเพิ่ม 3% q-q เป็น 16kboed

# หุ้นโรงกลั่นที่บูรณาการได้อย่างสมดุลย์

เราคงแนะนำซื้อที่ราคาเป้าหมาย 41 บาท เราคิดว่า BCP เป็นหุ้นโรงกลั่นที่น่าสนใจจากปัจจัย หนุนการเติบโตหลายประการในปี 2022 อันประกอบด้วยราคาน้ำมันและก๊าซที่สูงขึ้น, ความ ต้องการน้ำมันในประเทศที่สูงขึ้น, อัตรากำไรและปริมาณขายที่ปรับตัวดีขึ้นในธุรกิจที่ไม่ใช่ น้ำมัน, และกำไรในธุรกิจ E&P ที่อาจมี Upside TARGET PRICE THB41.00
