จาก Growth สู่ Dividend play

- การเติบโตของกลุ่มในปี 2024 มาจาก ITEL ขณะที่ธุรกิจของ ILINK คาดโตชะลอ จากที่เติบโตสูงในช่วง 2 ปีที่ผ่านมา
- การเซ็นสัญญาโครงการเกาะสมุยจะเป็น upside ต่อประมาณการ
- คงราคาเป้าหมาย 9.50 บาท แนะนำซื้อรับปันผล

การเติบโตของกลุ่มในปี 2024 มาจาก ITEL

บริษัทตั้งเป้ารายได้ 7.0 พันล้านบาทในปี 2024 ยังไม่รวมรายได้จาก BLUE และ GLS หากรวมทั้ง 2 บริษัทดังกล่าว เป้ารายได้จะเป็น 7.7 พันล้านบาท (+12% y-y) ขณะที่ ประมาณการของเรา คาดรายได้ 7.6 พันล้านบาท (+10% y-y) โดยส่วนผสมของราย ได้มาจากธุรกิจของ ITEL 44% ธุรกิจ Distribution (จัดจำหน่าย Cabling) 41% และธุรกิจ EPC (งานโครงการซึ่งส่วนใหญ่เป็นงานก่อสร้างสายเคเบิ้ลใต้น้ำ) 16% จากประมาณการ ของรายได้ รายได้จาก ITEL เดิบโตมากสุดในกลุ่มในปีนี้โดยคาด +21% y-y ขณะที่ธุรกิจ Distribution ซึ่งเติบโตสูงในช่วง 2 ปีที่ผ่านมา (ปี 2022-23) คาดว่าการเติบโตจะเริ่ม ชะลอเป็น +8% y-y ส่วนธุรกิจ EPC เราคาดรายได้ -9% y-y จะเห็นว่าการเติบโตของ กลุ่มในปี 2024 จะมาจาก ITEL

หากเซ็นสัญญาเกาะสมุยในปีนี้ จะเป็น upside ต่อประมาณการ

โครงการเกาะเต่ามูลค่า 1.8 พันล้านบาทจะสิ้นสุดโครงการราวเดือน เม.ย. 2024 บริษัท เหลืองานที่ต้องส่งมอบอีกเพียง 457 ล้านบาท แม้ว่าบริษัทจะชนะงานประมูลก่อสร้าง เคเบิ้ลใต้น้ำเกาะสมุย มูลค่าประมาณ 1.8 พันล้านบาท แต่ยังไม่ได้เซ็นสัญญา นอกเหนือจากโครงการเกาะสมุย ประเทศไทยยังมีโครงการก่อสร้างเคเบิ้ลใต้น้ำไปยัง เกาะต่างๆ อีกมากแต่ยังไม่มีการจัดประมูล ถือว่าเป็นโอกาสของ ILINK ในระยะต่อไป หากโครงการเกาะสมุยเซ็นสัญญาได้ภายในปี 2024 จะเป็น upside ต่อประมาณการของ เรา

คงประมาณการ

เราคงประมาณการกำไรปี 2024 ลดลง 5.6% y-y เป็น 502 ล้านบาท ซึ่งยังเป็นระดับที่ดี มากของบริษัท โดยหลักมาจากการลดลงของรายได้ EPC และอัตรากำไรขั้นต้นของ ธุรกิจ Distribution ที่ลดลงสูงระดับปกติ แรงขับเคลื่อนในปี 2024 จะเป็น ITEL แทนที่ แทบไม่เติบโตในปี 2023 เพราะงานประมูลต่างๆ เลื่อนตามงบประมาณการภาครัฐ ทั้งนี้ ประมาณการกำไรของเราในปี 2024 คิดเป็นอัตรากำไรสุทธิ 6.6% ต่ำกว่าเป้าของบริษัท ที่ 9% อยู่พอสมควร (ในปี 2023 อัตรากำไรสุทธิอยู่ที่ 7.7% สูงสุดในรอบ 8 ปี)

คงราคาเป้าหมาย 9.50 บาท คงคำแนะนำซื้อเพราะ Valuations ถูก

เราคงราคาเป้าหมาย 9.50 บาท (SoTP อิงราคาเป้าหมายของ ITEL และใช้ Target P/E ของ ILINK 7.5 เท่า) ILINK มีฐานะทางการเงินแข็งแกร่ง สภาพคล่องสูง จ่ายปันผล สม่ำเสมอ ผลตอบแทนเฉลี่ยปีละ 5% คงคำแนะนำซื้อ

ปี 2023 เป็นปีที่ดีมากของ ILINK จากการเปลี่ยนแปลงของ เทคโนโลยีทำให้ธุรกิจ Distribution เติบโตสูง ขณะเดียวกันบริษัทได้ งานประมลขนาดใหญ่คือเกาะเต่า และยังมีงานเกาะสมยที่รอเซ็น สัญญา

เราเชื่อว่าปี 2024 จะกลับสระดับปกติ แรงขับเคลื่อนในปี 2024 จะ เป็น ITEL เราเชื่อว่ารายได้จากธรกิจ Distribution จะโตต่อเนื่องแต่ อัตรากำไรขั้นต้นจะลดลงส่ปกติจากที่สงเป็นพิเศษในปี 2023 รายได้ จาก Engineering คาดลดลงหลังจากจบงานเกาะเต่าแต่อัตรากำไร เชื่อว่าจะยังรักษาได้ใกล้เคียงปีก่อน จึงคาดกำไรปี 2024 ชะลอ 5.6% y-y เป็น 502 ล้านบาท ซึ่งยังเป็นระดับที่ดีมากของบริษัท

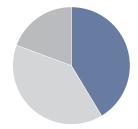

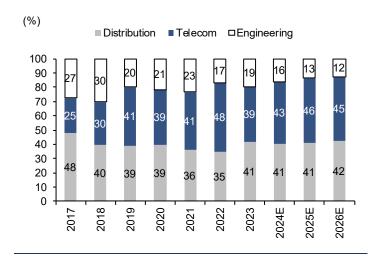

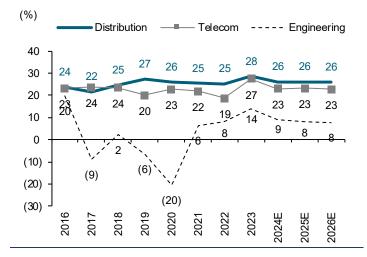

Exhibit 1: Revenue structure



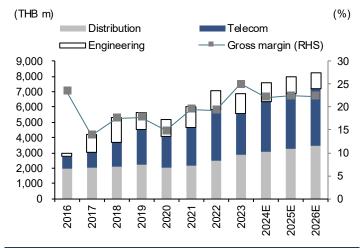

Exhibit 3: Gross margins by business unit



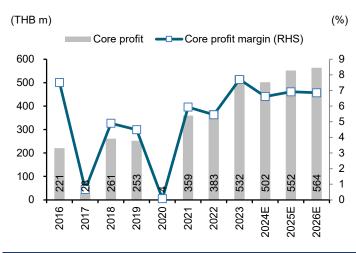
