4Q24 results at first glance

MTC รายงานกำไรสุทธิ 4Q24 อยู่ที่ 1.543พัน ลบ. (+14% y-y, +3.5% q-q) ใกล้เคียงกับที่เราและตลาดคาด

ผลประกอบการ 4Q24 มีปัจจัยหนุนสำคัญจากคุณภาพสินทรัพย์ที่ดีเกินคาดอันประกอบด้วย สัดส่วนหนี้ด้อยคุณภาพที่ต่ำกว่าคาดที่ 2.75% (เทียบกับ 2.84% ที่เราคาด) ต้นทุนความเสี่ยง ในการปล่อยสินเชื่อที่ 2.8% (เทียบกับ 3.0% ที่เราคาด) และอัตราการก่อตัวของหนี้ด้อย คุณภาพที่ต่ำเพียง 214bp ในขณะที่ส่วนต่างดอกเบี้ยต่ำกว่าที่เราคาดทั้งจากต้นทุนในการกู้ยืม ้ ที่สูงขึ้นและผลตอบแทนสินเชื่อที่ต่ำลง MTC รายงานสินเชื่อโตใกล้เคียงกับที่เราคาดโดยอยู่ที่ 14.6% y-y

สำหรับในปี 2024 MTC รายงานกำไรสุทธิ์ 5.867พัน ลบ. (+20% y-y) และประกาศจ่ายเงินปัน ผลต่อหุ้นอยู่ที่ 0.25 บาทสำหรับผลประกอบการในรอบปี 2024 (คิดเป็นอัตราการจ่ายเงินปันผล ที่ 9%) หุ้นจะขึ้น XD ในวันที่ 28 เม.ย.


เราคงคำแนะนำซื้อ MTC และราคาเป้าหมายปี 2025 ของเราที่ 60 บาท (GGM) เทียบเท่า 2.86x P/BV (ROE 18%, COE 10.2%) เราคาดว่า MTC จะรายงานกำไรสุทธิโตดีจากสินเชื่อที่ โตต่อเนื่องพร้อมโอกาสที่ต้นทุนในการกู้ยืม ต้นทุนในการดำเนินงานและตันทุนความเสี่ยงใน การปล่อยสินเชื่อจะลดลงประกอบกับคุณภาพสินทรัพย์ที่เอื้ออำนวย

Highlights

- (+) การเติบโตของสินเชื่อ: สินเชื่อขั้นต้นแตะ 164.2พัน ลบ. เพิ่มขึ้น 14.6% y-y และ 3.1% q-q ใกล้เคียงกับที่เราคาดโดยมีผลิตภัณฑ์สำคัญประกอบด้วยสินเชื่อทะเบียน รถยนต์และสินเชื่อทะเบียนรถจักรยานยนต์ ณ ไตรมาส 4Q24 MTC มีเครือข่ายสาขา รวม 8,172 แห่ง (+635 y-y, +141 q-q)
- (-) ส่วนต่างดอกเบี้ย: ตัวเลขอยู่ที่ 13.96% (-77bp y-y, -30bp q-q) จากผลตอบแทน สินเชื่อที่ลดลงเหลือ 17.52% (-16 bp q-q) และต้นทุนในการกู้ยืมที่สูงขึ้นเป็น 4.61% (+21bp q-q) ซึ่งต่ำกว่าประมาณการส่วนต่างดอกเบี้ยของเราที่ 14.2%
- (0) สัดส่วนค่าใช้จ่ายในการดำเนินงานต่อรายได้: ค่าใช้จ่ายในการดำเนินงานสูงขึ้น 11% y-y และ 1.2% q-q ใน 4Q24 จากเงินจ่ายเพื่อเป็นแรงจูงใจให้แก่พนักงานและการขยาย สาขาซึ่งทำให้ได้สัดส่วนค่าใช้จ่ายในการดำเนินงานต่อรายได้อยู่ที่ 47.5% ใกล้เคียงกับที่
- (+) คุณภาพสินทรัพย์: เรามองว่าคุณภาพสินทรัพย์โดยรวมยังอยู่ในเกณฑ์ดี MTC รายงานสัดส่วนหนี้ด้อยคุณภาพอยู่ที่ 2.75% ใน 4Q24 เทียบกับ 2.82% ใน 3Q24 และ 3.62% ใน 4Q23 ซึ่งเรามองว่าปรับตัวดีขึ้น นอกจากนี้ต้นทุนความเสี่ยงในการปล่อย สินเชื่อยังอยู่ที่เพียง 2.8% (ต่ำกว่าประมาณการของเราที่ 3.0%) จากการตัดจำหน่ายหนึ่ ด้อยคุณภาพ^{ี่}ที่ลดลงเหลือ 837 ลบ. เราคำนวณว่าอัตราการก่อตัวของหนี้ด้อยคุณภาพ ของ MTC ใน 4Q24 อยู่ที่ 214bp เทียบกับที่เคยสูงสุดที่ 393bp ใน 4Q22 ทั้งนี้สัดส่วน สำรองต่อหนี้ด้อยคุณภาพอยู่ที่ 135% ปรับตัวดีขึ้น q-q

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


