ยอด Presales 1Q25 เติบโตดี

Highlights

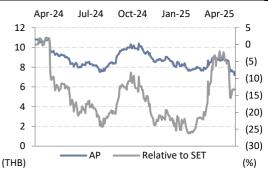
- AP รายงานยอด Presales 1Q25 อยู่ในเกณฑ์ดีที่ 1.2 หมื่นลบ. (+31% q-q, +25% y-y) แบ่งเป็นสัดส่วนแนวราบ 78% และคอนโด 22%
- มีแรงหนุนหลักจากยอด Presales แนวราบขยายตัว 42% q-q และ 40% y-y แม้มีการ เปิดตัวโครงการแนวราบเพียง 1 แห่ง มูลค่า 1.45 พันลบ. แต่ยอดขายที่โตได้ดีมาจาก ความคืบหน้าการขายของโครงการในมื้อซึ่งมีจำนวนเพิ่มขึ้นเป็น 163 โครงการ (เทียบ กับ 145 โครงการใน 1Q24) นอกจากนี้ บริษัทฯ ยังปรับกลยทธ์ด้วยการทำตลาด ออนไลน์ที่สามารถเข้าถึงกลุ่มเป้าหมายได้แม่นยำมากขึ้น
- ยอด Presales คอนโดอยู่ที่ 2.65 พันลบ. (+3% q-q, -8% y-y) โดย AP เปิดตัวคอนโด ใหม่อย่าง Life Sathorn-Narathiwas 22 มูลค่า 1.8 พันลบ. และมี Take-up rate 25% ใกล้เคียงกับเป้าบริษัท
- ในระหว่างไตรมาส AP เข้าร่วมงาน House and Condo Expo ในช่วงวันที่ 20 ถึง 23 มี.ค. 2025 ซึ่งสร้างยอดขายได้ขั้นต้นได้ 3พัน ลบ. ประกอบด้วยแนวราบ 60% และ
- ยอด Presales 1Q25 คิดเป็น 22% ของเป้าทั้งปีที่บริษัทตั้งไว้ที่ 5.5 หมื่นลบ. (+18% y-

Outlook

- ภายหลังเหตุการณ์แผ่นดินไหว AP ยังยืนยันแผนธุรกิจปี 2025 ตามเดิมที่ตั้งเป้าเปิดตัว 42 โครงการใหม่ มูลค่ารวม 6.5 หมื่นลบ. และแผนการโอน 4 คอนโดสร้างเสร็จใหม่ มูลค่าโครงการรวม 1.04 หมื่นลบ. ซึ่งมี Take-up rate เฉลี่ย 80%
- เบื้องต้นเราคาดกำไร 1Q25 ลดลง q-q และ y-y อยู่ที่ 800-900 ลบ. (เทียบกับ 1.3 พัน ลบ.ใน 4Q24 และ 1 พันลบ.ใน 1Q24) โดยการหดตัว q-q ตามยอดโอนที่ลดลงหลัง เปิดตัวโครงการแนวราบน้อยลงและไม่มีคอนโดสร้างเสร็จใหม่ ส่วนอัตรากำไรขั้นต้นขา ยอสังหาฯคาดระดับ 31-32% ลดลงจาก 33.7% ใน 1Q24 กดดันจากการทำโปรโมชั่น ราคาและการแข่งขันที่รนแรงโดยเฉพาะในตลาดแนวราบ
- เราคาดว่ากำไร 1Q25 จะเป็นจุดต่ำสุดของปี ก่อนฟื้นตัวใน 2Q25 ผลักดันจากการเริ่ม โอน 3 คอนโดใหม่ (AP 1 แห่ง และ JV 2 แห่ง) นอกจากนี้ มีแผนเปิดตัวโครงการใหม่ เพิ่มขึ้น และผลจากการเริ่มมาตรการผ่อนคลายเกณฑ์ LTV ในเดือนพ.ค. 2025
- เรายังติดตามผลกระทบของเหตุการณ์แผ่นดินไหวต่อยอดขาย ซึ่งมองว่ากระทบตลาด คอนโดชะลอตัวในระยะสั้น ทั้งนี้ ประมาณการกำไรปี 2025 ของเราที่ 5.1 พันลบ. (+2% y-y) บนคาดการณ์ยอดโอน 4.7 หมื่นลบ. (รวม JV) แบ่งเป็นแนวราบ 75% และคอนโด 25% กรณีให้ยอดโอนคอนโดลดลง 30% จากคาดการณ์ของเรา (การหดตัวในระดับ เดียวกับยอด Presales แนวราบลดลงในช่วงน้ำท่วม) จะส่งผลให้มี Downside 7% ต่อ ประมาณการกำไรปีนี้

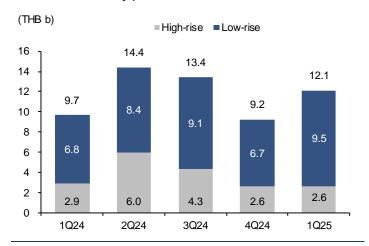

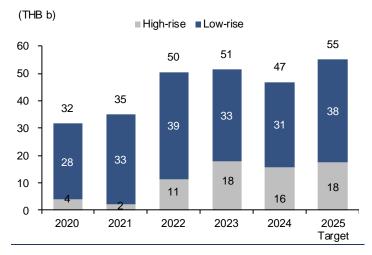

Exhibit 3: Yearly presales

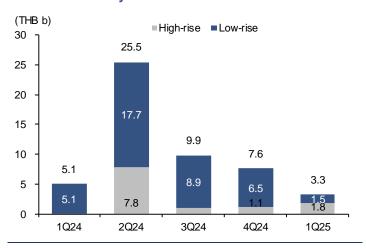

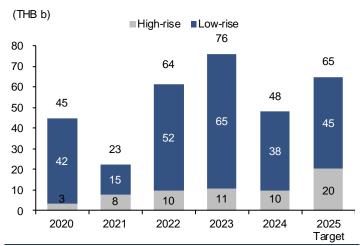
