2Q25 results at first glance

2025 กำไรปกติแข็งแกร่งตามเราและตลาดดาด

Highlights

- CKP กำไรสุทธิ์ 2Q25 ที่ 610 ลบ. เพิ่มขึ้นจาก 70 ลบ. ใน 1Q25 และ 74 ลบ. ใน 2Q24 หลักๆ มาจากส่วนแบ่งกำไรจากบริษัทร่วมปรับเพิ่มขึ้นอย่างมีนัยสำคัญ จาก FX gain เท่ากับ 324 ลบ. ที่เกิดจากยอดหนี้เป็นสกุลเงินดอลลาร์กว่า 460 ล้าน เหรียญสหรัฐในโครงการโรงไฟฟ้าหลวงพระบางเพราะค่าเงินบาทแข็งในช่วง 2Q25 และโรงไฟฟ้าไซยะบุรีมีกำไรจากการดำเนินงานปกติเพิ่มขึ้น โดยคาดปริมาณการ ขายไฟฟ้า +22% q-q และ +21% y-y อยู่ที่ 1,695 ล้านหน่วย แต่มีขาดทุนจาก FX 64 ลบ. จากเงินบาทแข็งค่า สำหรับรายได้หลักจากโรงไฟฟ้าน้ำงึม 2 เพิ่มขึ้น q-q, y-y โดยคาดมีปริมาณการขายไฟอยู่ที่ 525 ล้านหน่วย +32% q-q, +2% y-y ขณะที่ โรงไฟฟ้าพลังงานความร้อนร่วม (BIC) มีรายได้และกำไรลดลงทั้ง q-q, y-y จากค่า Ft ที่ปรับลง และค่าก๊าซเพิ่มขึ้น
- ส่วนค่าใช้จ่ายบริหารและดำเนินงานปรับเพิ่มขึ้น q-q, y-y แต่ดอกเบี้ยจ่ายลดลงจาก คัตราดอกเบี้ยตลาดที่ปรับลง
- หากหักกำไรจาก FX ทั้งของบริษัทแม่และบริษัทร่วมไตรมาสนี้ประมาณ 247 ล้าน บาท จะมีกำไรจากการดำเนินงาน 353 ล้านบาท เพิ่มขึ้น 137% y-y ตามเราและ ตลาดคาด

Outlook

- แม้กำไรสุทธิ 1H25 อยู่ที่ 681 ลบ. คิดเป็น 45% ของประมาณการทั้งปี และกำไรที่ ดีขึ้นส่วนใหญ่มาจากก้าไรจาก FX ที่เกิดจากค่าเงินบาทแข็งค่าจากโรงไฟฟ้าหลวง พระบางที่มีหนึ้เป็นสกุลเงินดอลลาร์สหรัฐ จึงยังมีความไม่แน่นอน ขณะที่กำไรการ ดำเนินงานปกติยังเป็นไปตามที่เราคาด ดังนั้นเราจึงยังคงคาดกำไรสุทธิปี 2025 ที่ 1.5 พันลบ. +11% v-v
- เรายังคงคำแนะนำ ซื้อ ราคาเป้าหมาย 3.40 บาท ปัจจัยหนุนการเติบโตของกำไร หลักจะมาจากแนวโน้มดอกเบี้ยขาลงและกำลังเข้าสู่ Peak Season ใน 3Q25 ส่วน ระยะยาวจะมาจากโรงไฟฟ้าเชื่อนหลวงพระบาง 1.450 MW ที่จะ COD ในปี 2030

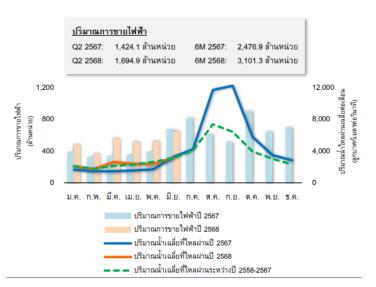

* In most cases, the target price will equal the analyst's assessment of the current fair value of the stock.
