2Q25 results at first glance

กำไรสุทธิ 2Q25 ใกล้เคียงกับที่เราคาด

Highlights

- RBF รายงานกำไรสุทธิ 2Q25 อยู่ที่ 97 ลบ. (-8.4% q-q, -5.3% y-y) เมื่อหักผลขาดทุน จากอัตราแลกเปลี่ยน 4 ลบ. กำไรปกติอยู่ที่ 101 ลบ. (-6.6% q-q, ทรงตัว y-y)
- การฟื้นตัวยังค่อนข้างช้าส่วนมากจากการบริโภคในประเทศที่อ่อนแอและลูกค้า
 ต่างประเทศใหม่ที่มาช้ากว่าคาดซึ่งทำให้รายได้โตเพียงเล็กน้อย (+1.3% q-q, +3.2% y-y)
- อัตรากำไรขั้นต้นทรงตัวที่ 35.1% ใกล้กับ 35.3% ใน 1Q25 และดีกว่า 34.7% ใน 2Q24
 อยู่เล็กน้อย ในภาพรวม Product mix ยังคงเดิมในขณะที่ต้นทุนวัตถุดิบยังทรงตัว
- สัดส่วนค่าใช้จ่ายการขายและบริหารต่อยอดขายเพิ่มเป็น 23.5% จาก 23.1% ใน 1Q25
 และ 22.9% ใน 2Q24 จากการใช้จ่ายเพื่อส่งเสริมการขายและตันทุนในการจัดงาน/ออก
 งานแสดงสินค้า

Outlook

- กำไรสุทธิ 1H25 อยู่ที่ 203 ลบ. (-26% y-y) คิดเป็นเพียง 38% ของประมาณการทั้งปี

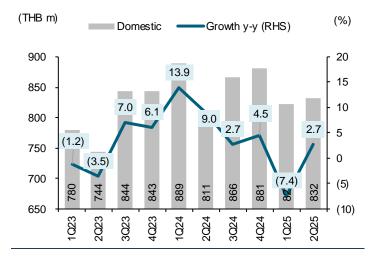

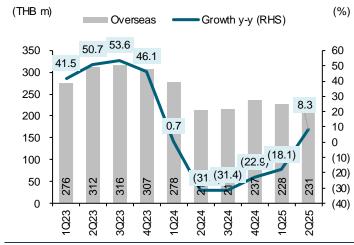

Exhibit 2: Domestic revenue and growth



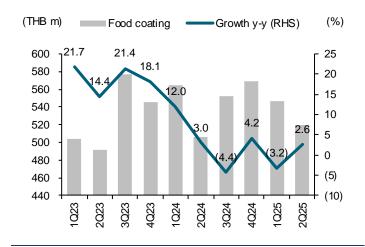

Exhibit 3: Overseas revenue and growth



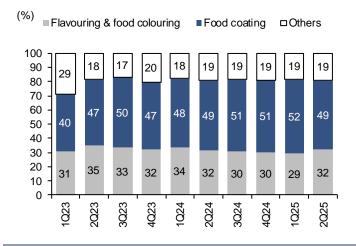

Exhibit 4: Revenue from food coating



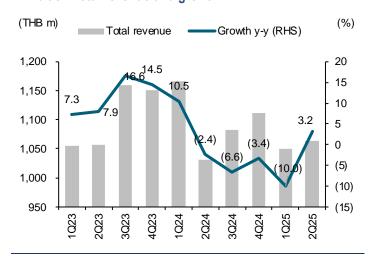

Exhibit 6: Revenue contribution by product



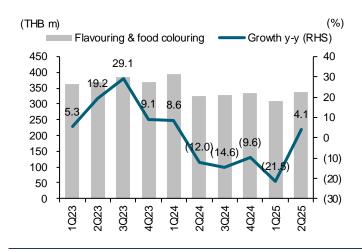

Exhibit 8: Total revenue and growth



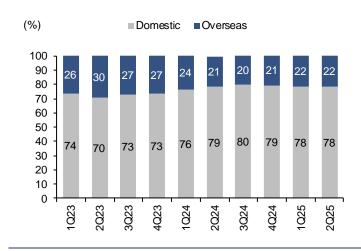

Exhibit 5: Revenue from flavouring and food colouring



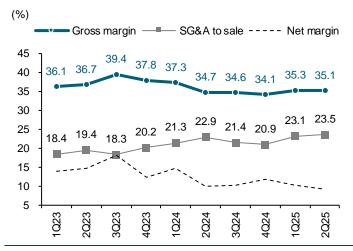

Exhibit 7: Revenue contribution by destination



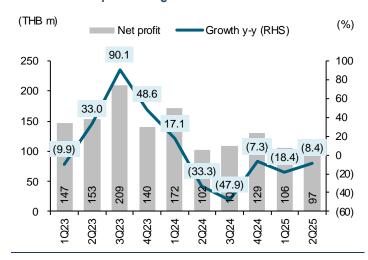

Exhibit 9: Gross margin and SG&A to sales



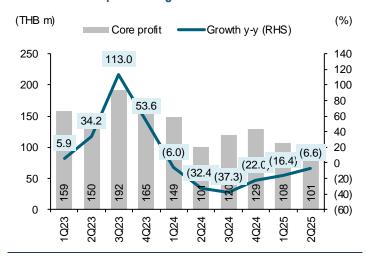

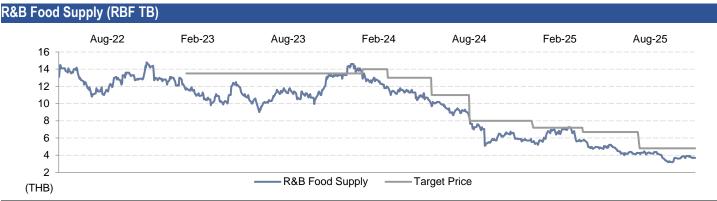
