2Q25 results at first glance

กำไรปกติ 2Q25 ต่ำกว่าคาดจากธุรกิจ Offshore Highlights

- TTA รายงานกำไรสุทธิ 2Q25 ที่ 90 ล้านบาท โดยมีรายการพิเศษรวม -81 ล้าน บาท (ขาดทุน FX 224 ล้านบาทและกำไรจากการขายบิทคอยน์ 155 ล้านบาท)
- หากตัดรายการพิเศษออก จะเป็นกำไรปกติ 171 ล้านบาท ดีขึ้นจากขาดทุน 185 ล้านบาทใน 1Q25 แต่ลดลง 60.9% y-y และต่ำกว่าคาด 23% จากผลขาดทุนของ ธรกิจให้บริการนอกชายฝั่ง (Offshore business) ที่มากกว่าคาด
- ค่าเงินบาทที่แข็งค่ากระทบธุรกิจส่วนใหญ่ของ TTA สำหรับธุรกิจ Offshore รับรู้ รายได้ USD109 ล้าน เมื่อแปลงเป็นเงินบาท ลดลง 6.5% q-q และ 35.9% y-y และมีอัตรากำไรขั้นตันเหลือเพียง 5.1% จากการซ่อมบำรุงนอกแผนและหยุด ทำงานชั่วคราวจากเหตุความไม่สงบในอิหร่าน และมีผลขาดทุนสุทธิ์ 151 ล้านบาท ใกล้เคียง 1Q25 ที่ขาดทุน 153 ล้านบาท
- ธุรกิจ Shipping เป็นตัวหลักในการทำกำไรใน 2Q25 แม้ว่าค่าระวางต่อลำต่อวันจะ ฟื้น 16.3% q-q เป็น USD12,291 แต่ยังอยู่ในระดับต่ำเพราะ Demand การขนส่ง สินค้าเทกองที่อ่อนแอ ส่วนรายได้ในรูปเงินบาทเพิ่มเพียง 1.4% q-q จากค่าเงิน บาทที่แข็งค่า อย่างไรก็ตาม อัตรากำไรขั้นตันฟื้นเป็น 28.8% เพราะคุมตันทุนได้ดี ทำให้ธุรกิจ Shipping มีกำไร 256 ล้ารือที่ถูกนบาท (+47.6% q-q, -51.9% y-y)
- ภาพรวมใน 1H25 ผลประกอบการหดตัวตามตลาดเรือเทกองที่ชะลอ ดัชนี BSI 29.5% y-y ค่าระวางเรือของ TTA -17.9% y-y เหลือ USD12,291 ต่อลำต่อวัน ขณะที่ธุรกิจ Offshore มีรายได้ที่ลดลง 13.9% ตาม Backlog และมีอัตรากำไร ขั้นต้นที่ลดลงเหลือเพียง 5.7% จาก 11.7% ใน 1H24 ส่งผลให้ TTA มีผลขาดทุน จากการดำเนินงานปกติ 14 ล้านบาทใน 1H25 แย่ลงจาก 1H24 ที่มีกำไรปกติ 824 ล้านบาท
- TTA ประกาศโครงการซื้อหุ้นคือตั้งแต่ 18 ส.ค. 2025-13 ก.พ. 2026 วงเงินไม่เกิน
 1 พันล้านบาท จำนวนหุ้นไม่เกิน 182 ล้านหุ้น (10% ของทุนชำระแล้ว)

Outlook

- ปัจจุบันเข้าสู่ High season ของ demand ในการขนส่งทางเรือ และดัชนี BSI เฉลี่ยใน 3QTD อยู่ที่ 1,210 จุด (+25.8% q-q) แนวโน้มผลประกอบการของ TTA ควรดีขึ้นใน 3Q25 ประกอบกับธุรกิจ Offshore ไม่น่าจะมีค่าใช้จ่ายซ่อมบำรุงขนาดใหญ่ และมีรายได้รอรับรู้ USD223 ล้าน
- อย่างไรก็ตาม TTA มีผลขาดทุน 14 ล้านบาทใน 1H25 ขณะที่เราคาดทั้งปีเป็น กำไร 881 ล้านบาท อาจทบทวนประมาณการอีกครั้งหลังการประชุม แนะนำขาย

Exhibit 2: Revenue structure and gross margin





Exhibit 3: Core profit and core profit margin
