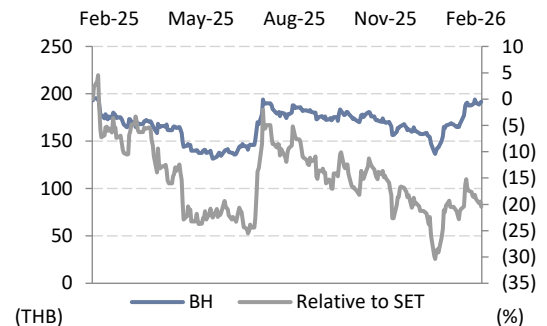

### Highlights

- เรามองโหนดการประชุมเป็นกลาง โดยการเติบโตของรายได้ปี 2026 จะขับเคลื่อนโดยกลุ่มคนไข้ชาวต่างชาติ และการปรับขึ้นราคาค่าบริการ 4% ซึ่งคนไข้จากกลุ่มตลาดตะวันออกกลางและอินโดจีน (สัดส่วนราว 24% และ 11% ของรายได้รวม) มีแนวโน้มกลับมาขยายตัวหลังจากลดลง 4-5% y-y ในปี 2025 รวมถึงการทำตลาดมากขึ้นในบังกลาเทศและการฟื้นตัวของคนไข้ชาวจีนจะช่วยหนุนโมเมนตัม
- สำหรับกลุ่มคนไข้ชาวคูเวต BH ได้รับชำระเงินค้างจ่ายทั้งหมดแล้วใน 4Q25 และอยู่ระหว่างติดตามความคืบหน้าการกลับมาส่งต่อผู้ป่วยภายใต้โครงการรัฐสวัสดิการ (GOP) ซึ่งคาดว่าจะเกิดขึ้นในปี 2026 และบริษัทยังมีโอกาสได้รับคัดเลือกเป็นโรงพยาบาลส่งต่อ ปัจจุบันคนไข้ชาวคูเวตคิดเป็น 1-2% ของรายได้รวม (ชำระเงินสดทั้งหมด) ลดลงจาก 5-6% ก่อนหน้า เราประเมินว่าหาก GOP กลับมา จะมี upside ต่อประมาณการรายได้ราว 1-4%
- คนไข้จากซาอุดีอาระเบียยังเป็นตลาดที่มีศักยภาพเติบโตสูงในระยะยาว แม้ยังต้องใช้เวลาในการทำตลาดเพิ่มเติม โดยผู้บริหารคาดว่าจะเห็นความร่วมมือที่ชัดเจนขึ้นหลังการจัดตั้งรัฐบาลชุดใหม่ของไทย ซึ่งเป็น upside ต่อกำไรในระยะยาว
- ปริมาณคนไข้ชาวไทยยังมีชะลอตัวจากความกังวลด้านปัญหาภูมิรัฐศาสตร์และภาวะเศรษฐกิจที่กดดันกำลังซื้อ แม้ปริมาณคนไข้อาจลดลง แต่คาดว่าจะถูกชดเชยบางส่วนด้วยความซับซ้อนของโรคที่เพิ่มขึ้น
- แผนเปิดโครงการอาคารชอย 1 (59 เตียง) ในกรุงเทพฯ และโรงพยาบาลบำรุงราษฎร์ อินเตอร์เนชั่นแนล ภูเก็ต เฟส 1 (50 เตียง) ถูกเลื่อนจาก 1H27 เป็น 2H27 เราคาดว่าไม่มีผลกระทบต่ออย่างมีนัยสำคัญต่อประมาณการ ขณะที่ค่าใช้จ่ายก่อนเปิดดำเนินงานอาจเป็นปัจจัยท้าทายต่อมาร์จิ้นและกำไรในปี 2027
- ผู้บริหารให้เป้าหมายรายได้ 1Q26 เติบโต 2-3% y-y โดยได้รับผลกระทบจากกลุ่มคนไข้ตะวันออกกลางที่ลดลงช่วงรอมฎอนเต็มไตรมาส ในเบื้องต้น เราคาดว่ากำไรปกติ 1Q26 ที่ 1.78 พันลบ. (-6% q-q, +2% y-y) บนรายได้ 6.33 พันลบ. (-3% q-q, +3% y-y) และ EBITDA margin 38.1% (-0.8ppt q-q, +0.4ppt y-y) โดยคาดว่าจะกำไรจะกลับมาเติบโตใน 2Q26 จากฐานต่ำปีก่อนที่ได้รับผลกระทบจากเหตุแผ่นดินไหวในประเทศไทย
- เรายังคงประมาณการกำไรปกติปี 2026 ที่ 7.74 พันลบ. (+3% y-y) บนรายได้เติบโต 4% และคงคำแนะนำ "ถือ" ราคาเป้าหมาย 194 บาท (DCF) เทียบเท่า 20x P/E ปี 2026E (-0.5SD) เนื่องจากมี upside จำกัด อย่างไรก็ตาม ROE ที่ 26% และอัตราผลตอบแทนเงินปันผลที่น่าพอใจ (รวมเงินปันผล 2H25 และเงินปันผลพิเศษ) จะช่วยหนุน valuation อย่างต่อเนื่อง

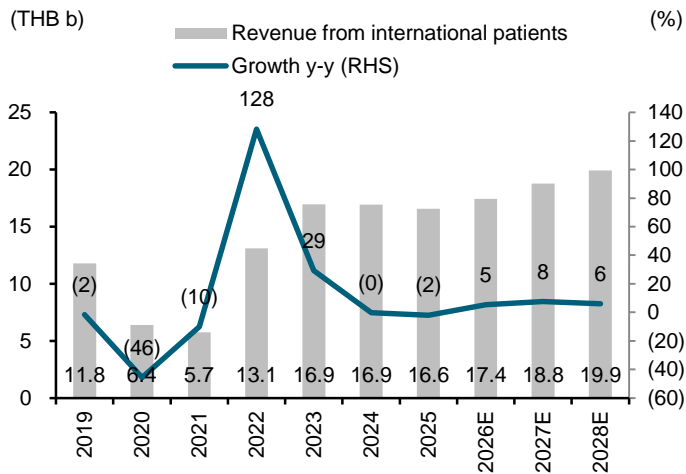

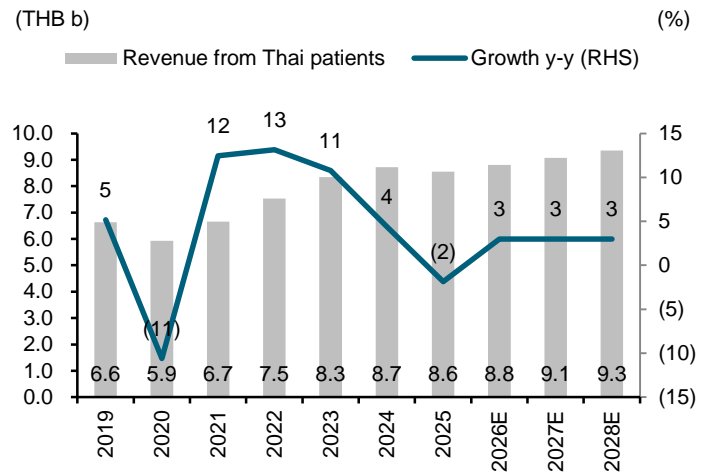
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### Exhibit 1: International patient revenue



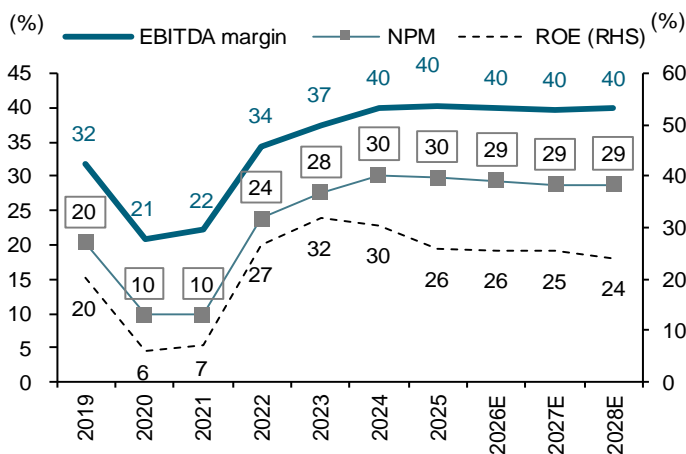

### Exhibit 2: Thai patient revenue



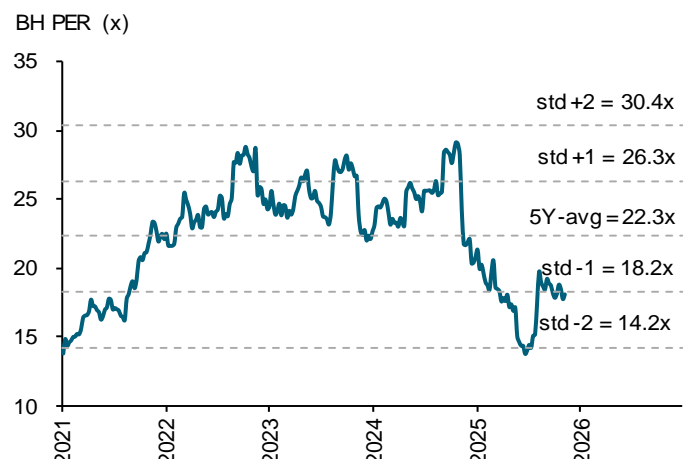

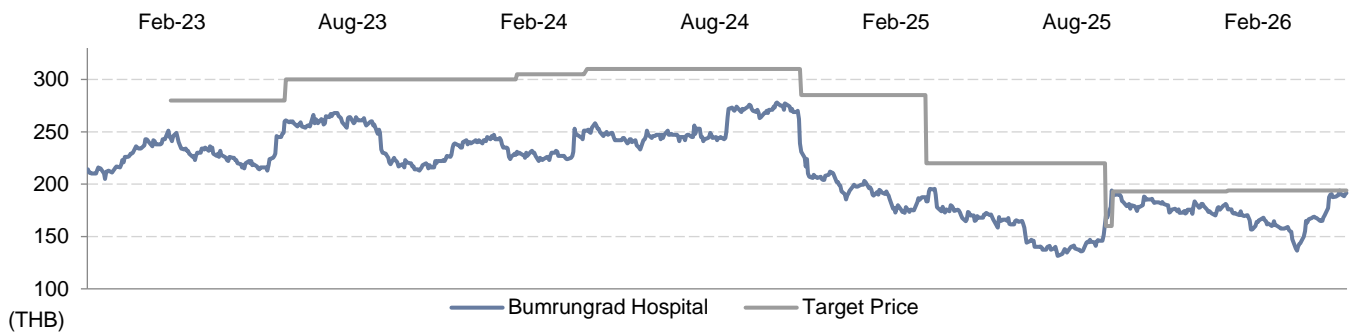
